It's been two months since more than 2,000 the bright yellow reusable Shop the Rock/BYO Bag bags were distributed and began appearing in Glen Rock stores.

To encourage shoppers to use these bags, the project sponsors are sharing these tips to help shoppers remember to bring their bags with them.

### At home

- Write "Take bags" at the top of your shopping list.
- Clip the bag to your shopping list.
- Store your bags in the place you associate with shopping by your purse or keys, or hanging from the door knob
- Keep a few extra bags in your car.
- Have an ample supply of reusable bags. Get a cute bag you like.
- Purchase a few compact reusable bags to keep in a purse, jacket pocket, or backpack, or attached to a keychain.
- Explain to your kids why you take back bags and put them in charge of helping you remember them.

## At the store

- If you've left your bags in the car, walk back out of the store to get them.
- When you take a cart or basket, make sure you have a bag to put in it.

- Tell the clerk right away that you have your own bags and don't need one.
- Put the bags in front of or on top of your order or groceries on the conveyor belt, so that baggers and checkers notice them before they start bagging.
- · As soon as you empty your bags, put them back in the car or wherever they belong so they're ready for the next shopping trip

The GREC urges all shoppers to make reusable bags part of their shopping routine. Over 3 million single-use bags are distributed each year in Glen Rock. This initiative aims to reduce that by 25%.

Shop the Rock/BYO Bag is a joint initiative of the Glen Rock Environmental Commission, Chamber of Commerce, leading merchants and Glen Rock Borough Council. It is funded by grants from Sustainable Jersey and Clean Air-Cool Planet.
