


Grassroots Speedwell Avenue Highlands

MORRISTOWN — Someday, if the Speedwell Avenue redevelopment goes as envisioned, people will walk along a corridor to get from retail shops to a park surrounded by residential buildings in an area now the domain of garbage trucks.

The neighborhood around the Morristown train station one day might be home to additional residential buildings as more people start the day by walking instead of getting into a car.

And a change in traffic patterns could make it easier for pedestrians to get to the Green, the focus of many town activities but also a park that remains isolated from the rest of the downtown because

Morris County, a town that's been at the forefront of the sustainability movement. Some efforts are overseen by the town's Office of Sustainability, run by Paul Miller and funded with help from the Geraldine R.

Dodge Foundation. Others are proposals that will be considered as the town's

planners get public input for proposed additions and changes to the master plan.

The town is home to a building considered one of the greenest in the state, a combination parking garage and office building on Maple Avenue that contains a three-story bio-wall to filter air, thermal wells, and solar panels on the roof. It was built more than three years ago by the town Parking Authority with help from the Dodge Foundation, which became a tenant.

Miller said the town has embarked on several new sustainable efforts. They include a recent deal with Reliant Energy that he said will save the town \$250,000 in electricity costs over the next two years while also providing 50 percent of the power from renewable sources. And the town has plans to use efficiency software developed by a Parsippany company called Revelstone.

"We might look at how many vehicle miles our fleet travels," Miller said.

As Morristown steps up its sustainability efforts, Miller said it plans to seek a higher level of recognition from Sustainable Jersey, a state certification program that's part of a partnership that includes the League of Municipalities, the College of New Jersey, the state Department of Environmental Protection and the state Board of Public Utilities. Municipalities achieve certification by getting a certain amount of points for each of their sustainable efforts.



Morristown in the middle: Leaders envision town's sustainable future



"If I knew what should be done, it would be done," Abramson said.

Jonathan Rose played a big part in changing the Speedwell Avenue Redevelopment plan to include more green elements. The original plan proposed an interior courtyard surrounded by buildings facing away from it. The new proposal calls for buildings facing the interior where pedestrian walkways and a park would be constructed.

"It was about creating a place people will enjoy," Abramson said.

He said a proposal to produce a park-like landscape at Headquarters Plaza on the other side of Speedwell Avenue has "enormous potential." He also said he'd like to see more residential buildings to go along with the Highlands at Morristown Station, taking the place of warehouses and focusing development around mass transportation. And he was supportive of a local movement examining ways to integrate the Green with the surrounding area.

"How many major parks do you know of that have a traffic circle around it?" he asked.

The Morristown Pedestrian Project, using federal grant money, has been looking at ways to improve the area around the green for walking.

Composed of a coalition of groups, members of the project have discussed ways to change traffic patterns, perhaps making roads around the Green two-way instead of one-way and reducing the number of lanes.

"If cars are more easily routed, they won't be cutting over, so pedestrians can feel safer," said Denise Lanza, assistant deputy director of the Morris County Park Commission, a member of the coalition.

She said meetings are planned with the Morristown Partnership, along with state, county and town authorities to discuss various proposals. Then, she said, it will be up to someone else, perhaps a group yet to be formed, to help refine and implement them.
