





- Actions completed in 8 of 18 categories







- 4. Translate this information into the Master Action Tracking Spreadsheet so that your team can develop a plan to begin working toward silver certification
 - Download this from the <u>Green Team Resources Page</u>
 - Spreadsheet includes the action name, submission requirements, look-back period, approval period, resubmission requirements, and points for each action



Application Strategy

- 5. Examine the actions for which you have not yet submitted
- 6. Assign actions to your team by identifying those with an interest in a particular area or those with access to information (i.e. recycling depot to the recycling coordinator, natural resources inventory to an environmental commission member, etc.)

Steps – Creating a plan to get to 350+



- > Reviewed list of ongoing bronze actions & potential new actions with entire team
- > Evaluated what actions were already being done & how they could be improved to be eligible



- > Assigned action leader from green team
- > Assign municipal staff or consultant
- > Distribute Action Requirements





- > Held regular progress meetings
- > Staff assisted with challenges

Challenges we faced

<u>CAPACITY - IMPLEMENTING ACTIONS:</u> volunteers willing to work, but often lack the experience to navigate government systems and requirements



<u>Solution:</u> Assigned a municipal liaison point person to co-lead all actions



<u>CAPACITY – COMPLETING APPLICATION:</u> Application is time consuming <u>Solution</u> –Leadership established with all staff that application is important and assigned municipal point person and team to complete application



BUY IN: Concerns about actions that take significant resources or have potential for criticism from public



<u>Solution</u> – Communicate benefits to all stakeholders, use success stories from other municipalities. Be helpful and responsive in addressing concerns.



Persistence and Patience is Key!

Success is stumbling from failure to failure with no loss of enthusiasm.



Takeaways - Quick Reference

- Match team talent, passions, and abilities to actions
- Establish clear action items, who's responsible, and timelines for completion
- Regularly engage and support leadership
- Utilize Sustainable Jersey resources & staff
- Talk to other towns and ask for help!



Maintaining Momentum

Towns maintained momentum by:

- Building off of the "high" of attaining bronze certification and pursuing more than "certification" initiatives
- Sharing the workload
- Outlining to officials & other team members exactly what had to be done
- Creating mutually beneficial working relationship between town and sustainability goals






Maintaining Momentum

Towns maintained momentum by:

- Providing timelines for deliverables
- Utilizing the three rounds of submission and review to break up the work into manageable pieces
- Remaining "low key" but encouraging so as not to overwhelm volunteers
- "Lead by example" green team lead picked up for those that became overwhelmed





Action Strategy

- Identify actions approved from bronze certification & those with which you're already involved; use the Master Action Tracking Spreadsheet and assign actions to green team members
- Identify actions with a long shelf-life
- Pursue actions in which the town was interested
- Identify actions for which people have a passion
- Develop an "ordinance package" for sustainability policies





Action Strategy

 Identify actions that would create a positive image of the town and have a positive impact and/or identify those that directly benefit a sector of the community

Reach out to organizations in town and suggest actions on which they might be interested in working

Engage the help of interns



Challenges

Time

- Understanding requirements for each action submission, follow up research, collecting documentation
- · Spending time on actions that do not get completed
- Solution: Plan ahead and build in time for resolutions and ordinances to be passed

Satisfactory Documentation

Solution: Make sure to read action requirements carefully and call Sustainable Jersey if you
have questions about the validity of a piece of documentation

Access to Documentation

• Solution: Institutionalize a process with the municipality for gaining access to the documentation needed

Engaging the Community with the Green Team

 Solution: Publicize the work of the green team as much as possible through municipal communications and social media; solicit those with a common interest to work toward your goals

Challenges

Lack of Record Keeping

 Solution: Identify senior municipal officials and those with knowledge about the past

Recognition of Accomplishments

Solution: Invite all town groups to green team meetings; maintain transparency

Unsupportive High-Ranking Officials & Community Members

 Solution: Perseverance & have those on your side make a strong argument, highlight the benefits



Tips for Towns

- Look at the shelf life of your approved actions and resubmission requirements
- Take it one action at a time
- Try to secure a sustainability commitment from town leadership
- Establish a municipal staff representative to coordinate the effort
- Utilize interns to help with collecting and uploading documentation
- Plan ahead for documentation collection
- Tap into the knowledge of senior township officials
- See the light at the end of the tunnel








Silver Certification Benefits

- Prestige, pride, recognition for being a sustainable community
- Highlights all town accomplishments in one place
- Provides a roadmap for future action
- Greater sway with government leaders
- Green team leader recognition by the town
- Establishing the Green Team by ordinance
- Saving thousands of dollars on energy costs
- Priority access to Sustainable Jersey Grants Program and ability to apply for other grants

2020 Certification Cycle Timeline

May 17	 Initial Application Deadline Indicate actions you plan to earn credit for by marking "Completed"
Early-July	First round review comments provided
September 11**	Revision deadline to be eligible for recognition at the 2020 Sustainable Jersey Luncheon during the NJLM Conference
Mid-October	Second round review comments provided
November 22	FINAL application deadline
Mid-December	Final decision on pending applications

NOTE: If the majority of your actions do not have documentation, only mark enough actions completed to meet the minimum requirements for bronze certification. Additional actions can be added throughout the cycle.

2020 Census Complete Count Initiative

Why An Accurate Census Count is Important




\$23 billion in federal funding for New Jersey depends on Census counts, like SNAP, transportation planning, Environmental Programs, and more.



Two fewer representatives in Congress and **two fewer** electoral votes than in 1990.



Important to **improve the count**, especially in hard-to-count communities, across the state for full representation so communities can plan and manage public goods





Role of Green Teams & Getting Started

As a **trusted community voice**, green teams can help improve participation rates by sharing information about the importance of an accurate and complete count.

Earning Sustainable Jersey Points
