### **USE OF FUNDING**



## GRANT FUNDS CAN BE SPENT ON...

- Native woody plants (trees and shrubs) that only include:
- Bare root stock
- Tublings
- 1-gallon, and/or 2-gallon containers









• Grow tubes with a fiberglass or PVC support stake





 Up to two delivery fees associated with transportation of the plants or protection materials

#### **GRANT FUNDS CANNOT BE SPENT ON...**


Anything other than the native woody plants, tree tubes, support stakes, and up to two delivery fees needed for the project. Examples include:

- Non-native or ornamental plants
- Supplies such as gloves, shovels, etc.
- Equipment such as mower, auger, etc.
- Labor/contractor costs
- Invasive species removal
- Alternative plant protection materials such as fencing

Expenses that are ineligible for grant funds are the financial responsibility of the applicant and cannot be charged to the grant. Consider in-kind donations and volunteers to help cover some of the other costs.

Additional use of funding guidelines, purchasing requirements, and a sample budget template are available in the application information packet.

# HOW TO DETERMINE IF A PROJECT SITE IS ELIGIBLE



Use **NJ** Maps Conservation Blueprint tool to identify an eligible project site. Project sites must fall within the *Ecological Floodplain Areas*. Check the box to toggle this green reference layer on.

The land must be owned by either a municipality, school district, non-profit organization, or other county/state government entity. Project sites on private land are **NOT** eligible. Identify the landowner of your site after locating it using the Conservation Blueprint tool. Next, click on the "Show in Parcel Explorer" button. The Tax Records tab reveals who owns the land.

The webinar and application information packet include more information on how to use NJ Maps to select a project site, develop a project plan, and decide on a planting layout.

Another resource are Watershed Ambassadors who can assist applicants with their proposals, identifying information, and tree planting. TNC has met with this year's Ambassadors to educate them on the Roots for Rivers Reforestation Program ways they can help applicants.
