#### **Energy**

#### Waste

The Recycling Education and Enforcement action is now retired, and replaced with the <u>Recycling and Waste Reduction</u> <u>Education and Compliance</u> action. This action recognizes municipalities that have developed and implemented a comprehensive Recycling and Waste Reduction Education and Compliance Strategy for residents aimed at increasing

the quantity and quality of recycling materials collected from residents, while reducing the amount of solid wast they generate. This action is a Priority action worth 15 to 20 points.

# Did You Know the New Jersey Prevention Network Can Assist with Completing Sustainable Jersey Actions?

The New Jersey Prevention Network (NJPN) is a public health agency working to create healthier communities by reducing the burden of substance abuse, addiction and other chronic diseases. NJPN can assist with a variety of actions such as <a href="Smoke-Free and Tobacco-Free Public Places">Smoke-Free and Tobacco-Free Public Places</a>. Many towns in New Jersey have a smoke free ordinance, but may not be aware of it. The network has a list of towns that have this ordinance and is also readily available to help with the development of one. Completion of this action can earn a municipality 10 points toward its certification.

NJPN can also assist with Sustainable Jersey's priority action, <u>Prescription Drug Safety and Disposal</u>. The Network works with Statewide Regional Substance Abuse Coalitions who have the resources to help implement this action. Regional Coalitions can help market and organize a take-back day, and establish permanent drop boxes in police departments and other locations in the community. Some coalitions may have financial resources while others can provide technical assistance to municipalities in coordinating their efforts.
