# **New Funding Available for Municipalities and Schools**







Sustainable Jersey is pleased to announce that the PSEG Foundation is contributing \$200,000 to support a grants program cycle for municipalities and \$100,000 to support a grants program cycle for schools.

The municipal cycle will award four (4) \$20,000, eight (8) \$10,000 and twenty (20) \$2,000 grants to support efforts related to Sustainable Jersey <u>actions</u>. For more information, dick <u>HERE</u>. **The application deadline is Wednesday, February 28, 2018.**

## Opportunities for Adopting Electric Vehicles (EVs) in Municipal Fleets: A Primer

Public sector fleets are seeing significant benefits from the deployment of electric vehicles (EVs). By eliminating gas consumption, EVs reduce costs to fleets, promote energy independence and help protect the environment. This webinar will provide information for decision-makers to consider in determining how and when to add EVs to municipal fleets. We will discuss procurement options as well as provide an overview of both the benefits and challenges of fleet electrification. The webinar will introduce a new fleet analysis tool developed to assist municipalities in comparing the total cost of ownership for light duty vehicles and share information about EV Smart Fleets - an upcoming multi-state public sector fleet EV procurement opportunity for state and local governments. Information about New Jersey's Board of Public Utilities EV Stakeholder process will be included in the webinar.

## **Together North Jersey Transit Hub Workshop Series**



# New Jersey Clean Energy Program Compressed Natural Gas Heavy Vehicle Grant Program

If your municipality has been looking to switch from traditional trucks and buses and other heavy duty vehicles to compressed natural gas (CNG) ones, now may be the right time. The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities' CNG heavy vehicle grant program helps fund the incremental cost of a CNG powered vehicle over a comparable diesel vehicle. Awards will be capped at \$20,000 per vehicle and \$40,000 per applicant and will be processed on a first-come-first-served basis until funding is exhausted.
