Strategically Maximizing the Energy Efficiency of Your Building Portfolio Webinar

Combining New Jersey's Clean Energy Program (NJCEP) incentives with a strategic vision can help schools and municipalities finance energy efficiency upgrades to their facilities. Green Infrastructure Planning and Implementation: Find Out How to Get Your Points

This course will review the Sustainable Jersey green infrastructure actions. If your municipality is struggling with localized flooding or unhealthy waterways, you must come to this workshop. There are 35 points available for green infrastructure planning and another 45 points available for green infrastructure implementation. The Rutgers Cooperative Extension Water Resources Program has already completed green infrastructure plans for over 140 Sustainable Jersey municipalities. As part of the partnership between Sustainable Jersey and the Center for Community Engaged Learning and Research (CLER) at The College of New Jersey, we are pleased to announce an opportunity for Sustainable Jersey municipalities to enlist students from The College of New Jersey to support your green team on a specific project that contributes to your Sustainable Jersey certification. Possible projects include:

- Establishing and/or maintaining community gardens and raingardens
- Removing invasive species from a park as part of a larger community improvement plan
- Tree and shrub planting for reforestation and erosion control
- Community asset mapping in neighborhoods

Municipalities may submit more than one proposal for different projects on different days. Applications will be accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis up until the September 2 deadline. Applicants can expect to hear back within two weeks of submitting the application. This opportunity does not conflict with the Sustainable Jersey Grant Program cycles.

New Action Unveiled!

Sustainable Jersey is pleased to announce that the <u>Enhanced Stormwater Management Control Ordinance</u> is now available! This action awards points to municipalities that adopt a Stormwater Management Control

Ordinance that goes beyond state minimum requirements to improve water quality and reduce local flood risks. The ordinance seeks to achieve these higher goals through new retention requirements, a lower threshold for applicability to development and redevelopment, and additional requirements for green (vs. gray) infrastructure. This action awards between 10 and 30 points based on the scope of work completed.

ANJEC 2018 Environmental Achievement Award Nominations

The Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions (ANJEC) Environmental Achievement Award program recognizes exceptional projects carried out by environmental commissions and groups. Projects begun January 1, 2016 and completed by August 31, 2018 are eligible. Award categories include: environmental commission project; non-profit or community organization or board; and a recurring project. For more information, click here.

Informing Your Community about Energy Cost Saving Incentives

As a partner with Sustainable Jersey, New Jersey's Clean Energy Program ™ (NJCEP) Outreach Team offers assistance to Sustainable Jersey Regional Hubs and Green Teams to provide a deeper understanding of NJCEP and its benefits to your community. NJCEP offers incentives to undertake energy audits and energy efficiency upgrades, such as the <u>Direct Install</u> program for businesses and the <u>Home Performance with</u> ENERGY STAR® and Comfort Partners programs for residents.

The Outreach Team is available to present NJCEP details at your Hub or Green Team meetings, providing literature and answering questions via phone or email. This information can help Hub/Green Team members become more comfortable sharing NJCEP with local residents and businesses. The NJCEP Outreach Team is available to present or participate in public outreach events organized by Hubs and Green Teams.

These resources can help your municipality earn points for the <u>Residential Energy Efficiency Outreach</u> action and the <u>Commercial Energy Efficiency Outreach</u> action. Both of these actions can help your municipality achieve the Gold Star Standard in Energy!

Funding Opportunities

NJDOT Commitment to Communities Initiative

Applications are now being accepted for several of the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2019 State Aid programs. The initiative is designed to ensure local governments succeed in delivering transportation projects that improve the quality of life for those traveling in and through New Jersey. Each of the four programs are evaluated independently, affording local governments the opportunity to receive funding from more than one grant program. **The application deadline for all programs is October 8, 2018**. Municipal Aid Program

This program funds local transportation projects, such as those that support walking and biking within the community. All municipalities are eligible to apply.

Bikeways

This \$1 million program is intended to fund bicycle projects which create new Bike Path Mileage. Special consideration will be given to bikeways that are physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open

space or barrier. On-road bike lanes and other bike routes and facilities are also eligible for funding. All municipalities and counties are eligible to apply.

Safe Streets to Transit

This \$1 million program encourages counties and municipalities to construct safe and accessible pedestrian linkages to transit facilities in order to promote increased usage of transit by all segments of the population.

Transit Village

This \$1 million program will award grants for traditional and non-traditional transportation projects that enhance walking, biking and/or transit ridership within a half mile of the transit facility. Eligible applicants include municipalities designated as a Transit Village.
