New! Roots for Rivers Reforestation Grant and Technical Assistance Program

The Nature Conservancy of New Jersey (TNC) is partnering with Sustainable Jersey to offer this program to municipalities and school districts to support their efforts to undertake floodplain reforestation initiatives on public or private land. Program participants will receive technical assistance to design planting projects and funding to cover materials (trees and protection) associated with plantings. Projects costing between \$1,000 and \$20,000 are eligible.

Activities resulting from this grant/technical assistance opportunity could potentially apply to the <u>Community Education</u> & <u>Outreach</u>, <u>Tree Planting Programs</u>, or <u>Innovative Community Project</u> actions. For more information, visit our

Deadline Extended: Natural Gas Vehicle Grant Program

The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities has established a compressed natural gas (CNG) grant program available for Class 5 through 8 vehicles. The \$200,000 grant program will fund the incremental cost of a CNG powered vehicle over the equivalent diesel vehicle. Awards will be capped at \$25,000 per vehicle and \$50,000 per applicant and will be processed on a first-come-first-served basis until funding is exhausted. Eligibility is open to vehicles registered in New Jersey. Eligible applicants for the grant program include municipalities, political subdivisions, incorporated nonprofit entities, corporations and limited liability companies or partnerships registered to do business in New Jersey. The Recycling Partnership Cart Grant

The Recycling Partnership is a national nonprofit that uses highly leveraged grants coupled with technical assistance to help improve and empower communities. This grant will provide funding (up to \$7/cart) and technical assistance to upgrade residential curbside recycling programs by providing carts to households as well as education. Applications are open to counties, municipalities, and solid waste authorities/districts with 4,000 or more households. For more information, visit their website.
