Program Summary: The Township of Southampton supports responsible pet ownership in the community. The township has taken an initiative to protect the well-being of animals in the community. By doing so, the Companion Animal Plan was generated which clearly identifies all the ordinances related to feral cats and dog licensing and monitoring. This Ordinances are: Feral Cats 3.15 and Dog Ownership 5.1 to 5.4. Dog Licenses are due prior to March 31 of each year. Each year, notices are sent to the residents for free rabies shots given the first weekend of January for cats and dogs. Per the ordinance: "The chief of police of the township, or such other person as may be designated by resolution of the township committee, shall make or cause to be made an annual canvass of all dogs owned, kept, or harbored within the Township limits and shall file a report thereof with the township clerk not later than January 31 of each year." Program Summary: Wind ordinance 2012-4 On April 17, 2012, Southampton Township adopted the Alternate Energy Ordinance. This Ordinance, Ordinance Number 2012-4, allows for Wind and Solar systems to be used in the township. This was enacted and updated to the township's land use codes and is consistent with the Master Plan which exists. All installations must be reviewed and approved by the DEP and to be in conformance with the Pinelands policies and procedures. Permits are granted through the Township of Southampton Construction office and all plans must be reviewed by the Zoning Board prior to installation. Zoning board and Planning Board receive notices at their monthly meetings - see example of minutes from Planning Board.

Program Summary: The current composition of the Southampton Township consists of 18 Public Works heavy duty trucks such as dump and trash trucks (3 are gas all others diesel). The maintenance is handled by the Public Works Garage unless specialized repairs are needed. All drivers operating the vehicles have passed a driver training course and safety purposes. The drivers are signed up for the on line course for environmental driving. Since Southampton Township has a large area to cover even though the town is small, the use of bicycles or smaller vehicles is impractical. In 2009, another review including members of the community and various township committee members was completed generating the Southampton Township Master Plan Rural Sustainability Plan Vision 2030 (see attached). This was also incorporated into the Master Plan on May 16, 2010 (see attached).

Clustering Ordinance

10 Points

Program Summary: Southampton Township has had a clustering ordinance which was approved in 2001 (see attached ordinance 12-4 and 19- Pinelands Ordinance). The clustering ordinance's basic purpose is to permit the development of residential clusters to provide a method of developing land, which creates desirable open space, conservation areas; flood plains, recreation areas and parks by permitting the reduction in lot sizes without increasing the number of residential lots otherwise permitted. In 2009, a grant was authorized to further define clustering and this was added to the Master Plan in 2010 (see excerpt of presentation which was uploaded). Also included is the final summary of the Rural Sustainability Plan which identifies the reasons and impacts of clustering for the good of the community. The main reason for the clustering ordinance is to assure the preservation of over 2,600 acres of farmland and to maintain the "rural character" of this municipality. In addition, Southampton resides in the New Jersey Pinelands and Southampton Township conforms to their rules and regulations. The Pineland Protection Act encourages land preservation.

Tree Protection Ordinance *Retires 12/31/25*

Program Summary: Southampton Township is in a unique position in the state of New Jersey. The township is covered by the policies of the Pineland Commission and Southampton has various ordinances covering tree and shrub maintenance. There is also a Shade Tree Commission which monitors the health of trees in the township and when work is required the commission contacts the Public Works Department for assistance. The Natural Resource Inventory was also generated to document the flora and fauna and all the natural resources that are found in the township. With the approval of the Sustainable NJ Vision 2030, this also cited maintaining a wooded area and preserving the Pine Lands. Ordinances covering tree protections 2.4 – Shade Tree Commission – Authorization and Powers 8.7 – Property Maintenance Code – sites land use controls and what property owners can or cannot do regarding trees Chapter XIX Pinelands Development – also regulates trees and species.

Program Summary: Community Forestry and Canopy Plan Two documents updated per the review comments - Signed copy of the community Forestry Plan and the Approved document of our 2012 Annual Report. In 2012, Southampton Township received a grant to prepare a Community Forestry Plan. This was completed and signed by the township committee in December 2012. This plan covers our goals and objectives and a 5 year plan was identified. The Shade Tree Commission and members of the Southampton Public Works have been attending classes and receiving the required Continuing Education Units (CEU) which is also required to become a Tree City USA recipient. Southampton has been a Tree City recipient for over 18 years. The Township prides itself on the rural nature of the community and by generating a Community forestry Plan only strengthens this commitment. Tree Maintenance Programs

10 Points

Program Summary: The Southampton Shade Tree Committee, per the Shade Tree Ordinance, monitors the town's street trees as well as the trees throughout the township. The Shade Tree has specific forms which can be filled out by residents regarding the tree's health and removal. The committee prioritizes the trees that need to be either removed or pruned, and assesses based on their annual budget from the township. Each tree is evaluated individually based upon safety and liability issues. The committee creates the bids, supervises the work by contractors, and inspects the final work for approval. Problem trees are removed and stumps grinded. Pruning is done selectively as warranted. Public Works will take care of most chipping throughout the township and remove small trees, but require contracted services for larger trees and in most cases requires coordination from one of three of the utility companies to remove trees near or around high tension wires. Jersey Central Power and Light, Public Service Electric and Gas, and Atlantic City Electric pruned tree within 10' of their electrical conductors. ST is a Tree City USA for 17 years and received our 2nd Growth award for 2014.

Tree Planting Programs

Program Summary: Southampton to plant trees for Arbor Day —The township Shade Tree Commission is partnering with environmental clubs from Shawnee and Seneca high schools to

plant more than 50 small trees along the recreation field. The work begin around 3 p.m. Friday, April 26, which is when New Jersey celebrates Arbor Day, and is ended around 5 p.m. The participants planted trees at the municipal building and recreation center. According to a press release from the township, the Shade Tree Commission received the trees from the New Jersey Tree Foundation. which offered free trees to local governments and other groups on the condition that the recipient agree to maintain the trees for at least two years. In addition, local landscapers donated larger trees, which the department of public works will plant throughout Southampton the week of April 21 to celebrate both Earth Day and Arbor Day. Also on April 26, a larger tree donated by Atlantic City Electric will be planted at Southampton School No. 1, during a celebration from 1 to 3 p.m. for students in grades 1-3 there. The tree planting will offset the loss of trees due to severe weather and gypsy moths. Trees being planted include Eastern redbud, green ash, red maple and honey locust.

Program Summary: Community Paper Shredding Day Each year there is a community recycling day promoting shredding of confidential documents and recycling of old computers and televisions. This event is held at the Robert C. Shinn, Jr. Recycling Center in Westampton at the recycling plant for residents of Burlington County only, no businesses or non-profits. ID required. The information regarding the event is published in the local newspapers: Burlington County Times and the Central Record. Flyers are also distributed within the township. For the calendar year 2012 the following information amount of paper that was collected was 2.5 tons. Southampton also has four (4) large containers available at the municipal building for paper recycling. These bins are emptied and taken to the recycling center every three weeks. The statistic for this material are showing an increase from 2011 to 2012: 2011: Corrugated paper

146.42 tons, Mixed Office Paper 17.53 tons, Newspapers 785.82 tons Other Paper 39.58 tons, Total for 2011 is 989.35 tons 2012: Corrugated paper 219.64 tons, Mixed Office Paper 16.10 tons, Newspapers 764.01 tons Other Paper 42.48 tons, Total for 2012 is 1042.23 tons For the May 2013 event, approximately 100 residents from Southampton dropped off paper for shredding - 30 pounds per household which is over a ton of paper recycled.

Program Summary: Recycling Program for Sustainable NJ Southampton Ordinance 9.5 See the excel sheets for details of collections. Southampton Township's recycling of cardboard, paper, bottles and cans is collected by the OTC and delivered to the Burlington County Complex in Florence, NJ every other Monday. In addition, Southampton residents at our public works facility at 16 Buddtown Road, Southampton, NJ there are has four (4) large containers available at the municipal building for paper recycling. These bins are emptied and taken to the recycling center every three weeks. Since the bins are accessible 24/7 it is unknown how many people use the facility In 2014, Southampton distributed large recycle bins for same stream collection of paper, glass and plastic. Our public works department also collects leaves and grinds up branches that are composted by a local landscaper. The department of public works will pick up white goods (refrigerators, washer, dryers) and tires for a fee. They are then taken to the Burlington County Complex for disposal. At this time, any electronic waste is brought to the Burlington County Complex or Goodwill by the resident. Our recycling brochure is mailed to each resident annually, as well as posted on our website. This lists the date for recycling collection pick up, as well as explanatory pictures of what is and what is not recycled. Residents have also been able to recycle batteries/oil/plastics at the Public Works department. In addition large items can be collected for a small fee.
