Establishing a Local Fire Safety Council will Soon Be a Wildfire Preparedness Action



<u>Degolia Wildfire</u> 4/27/2014 Waterford Township, Camden County 907 acres Why is this Important?

- Local Fire Safety Councils coordinate local preparedness efforts at the Municipal level.
- They have access to technical and financial assistance through the NJ Fire Safety Council, NJ Forest Fire Service.
- They may coordinate grant efforts, keep Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP's) current and provide outreach directly to the community.
- They provide direct communication from the Municipality to Firewise Communities, and Ready-Set-Go! Fire companies

Establishing a Wildfire Safety Council - 10pts

- 1. Adopting a Municipal Ordinance establishing a Wildfire Safety Council is similar to ordinances and procedures establishing Shade Tree or Environmental Commissions.
- 2. A model Ordinance can be obtained at the NJ Fire Safety Council Website.

- 3. Wildfire Safety Council members are composed of: concerned citizens, Office of Emergency Management (OEM) staff, local fire chief(s), insurance industry representatives, utility company personnel, and usually a local elected official as an ex-officio or non-voting member.
- 4. The NJ Forest Fire Service can provide technical assistance to the Council.

Project Costs and Resource Needs are Very Small

- The attorney review costs may be underwritten by the Municipality using their attorney.
- Suitable Council members may be recruited from within Municipal staff, knowledgeable professionals and interested residents.
- Councils meet quarterly to plan outreach events, complete tasks, and seek training/financial assistance.
