Over the last month, Sustainable Jersey has posted two new water actions focused on assisting municipalities in engaging their residents to address the safety of their drinking water. In this 45-minute webinar, participants will learn about Removing Lead in Drinking Water, which will be of interest to communities with older housing where there are concerns about lead leaching into drinking water from lead service lines and lead pipes inside the home. The action aims to reduce exposure to lead in drinking water through awareness, education, testing

and remediation. And Private Well Testing, an action that provides guidance on how municipalities can use publicly available data to increase awareness about the safety of well water and encourage residents to proactively test their private wells. The session will end with a brief description on how these new actions can be used towards completion of the forthcoming Sustainable Jersey Gold Star Standard in Water. For nearly the last two months, households across the United States have been receiving the 2020 Census mailers encouraging completion of the 2020 Census online or by mail. U.S. Census Bureau representatives will join us to provide an update on the current state of Census operations and answer your questions. We also encourage municipalities and schools to join the discussion and share successful strategies used to encourage residents to respond to the 2020 Census. Much has happened over the past several years toward feeding hungry people and toward advancing sustainable organic material management.
