Food Insecurity Stats

Pre-COVID

- 37 million people in U.S.
- 11 million children in U.S.
- U.S. Dept. of Agriculture
- 1 in 12 people in N.J.
- 1 in 10 children in N.J.

Food Insecurity Stats

Since COVID

- 1 in 5 families reported (Dec 2020)
 <u>Save the Children</u>, 2021
- 13.5% residents of N.J. (projected)
- 1 in 20% children in N.J. (*projected*)

NEW! <u>Community Food Pantry/Bank</u> <u>and Soup Kitchen</u>

under Food > Food Security action category





Step 1: Operate a municipal food pantry/bank or soup kitchen in municipal facility w/ regular operating hours

Step 2: Post a directory of food pantries/banks and soup kitchens in the area

- Location, hrs of operation, contact info, requirements (ID, proof of residency or need), delivery
- Languages spoken, special diet accommodations, culturally relevant food, fresh/perishable items, choice or prepackaged



- Municipality can *meaningfully support* an existing pantry/bank or soup kitchen by providing:
 - Physical space
 - Storage for perishable foods
 - Transport of goods to/from collection and distribution points, on a regular basis
 - Staffing, on a regular basis
 - volunteer management, collection or distribution of goods, coordination with patrons, marketing, fundraising, etc.

 Coordinate a network of local/regional anti-hunger organizations



- Provide transportation for individuals to the food pantry/bank or soup kitchen
- Deliver food from pantries to individual homes *Not about delivering food or goods to the pantries



- Health Department
- Administration
- Public works pick up/distribution
- Connection to those in need green team, EC, senior services, recreation dept, community stakeholders, etc.



- Promotional material w/ evidence of it being a municipal program
- *Alternative*: Evidence of municipal support

 copy of MOU, shared use agreement, or signed statement by both entities outlining partnership

- Link or screenshot of food pantry directory on municipal website
- Additional 5 pts: Evidence of transportation

 O Proof of drop off/pick up schedules; promotional material



NEW! Expanded Supplemental Food Programs

under Food > Food Security action category



Option 1: Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)

- Children & teens in low income areas
- When schools is not in session (long vacations or summer months)

Option 2: Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

- Children and adults
- Enrolled for care at participating childcare, day care, adult day care, afterschool care, and emergency shelter programs

... or both for 20 points!



SFSP / CACFP

• Sponsor

o Total responsibility for administration of the program

Host a site

o Provide location where meals are served

o Setting must be supervised by administering organization

• Reimbursed for meals and operating/admin costs (reimbursement rates can be found in "Project Costs" section of action)



- Recreation department, and/or
- Administration
- Partners: schools, community orgs, emergency shelters, child & adult day care centers or camps



For either or both SFSP/CACFP programs

- Copy of Sponsor-Site Agreement or State Sponsor Agreement
- At least 2 weekly meal count forms (provided by state)
- **3**. Example of at least two:
 - Staff training records; site visit records; site review records; or program menu



under Food > Food Security action category





- Environmentally-friendly practices (5 pts)
 - Use of non-synthetic fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides, nutrient-rich soil;
 - Creation of eco-system to support nutrient-rich plants, soil microbes, and insects
- Create program to regularly donate excess food to local pantry (5 pts)
 - o Specific bed vs. weekly excess by volunteer plot owners
 - Process for plot owners to report what is(n't) available for donation
 - o Delivery mechanism
 - o Process to track donations
