




### **Project Type: Bicycle Corridor Plan**

#### Seaside Heights wants to make Central Avenue safer!

A Valikability Workshop engages borough employees, residents, and businesses on issue regarding walking and biking. After iteraming about whet to look for, workshop participants will walk a half-mile contidor assessing their existing streets and sidewalks and identifying issues to overcome to ensure safer and more welcoming conditions for pedestriams and biocyclists. After the workshop, a report will be prepared with recommendations on improvements to address key locations and issues islentified in the workshop.

This effort is part of the Complete Streets Technical Assistance Program, a collaboration between Sustainable Jersey, the Voorhees Transportation Center at Rudgers University, and the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA). 



#### **Resolution Requirement:**

To participate in this program, applicants must upload a resolution adopted by the municipal governing body as documentation that it is authorized to apply. The authorizing resolution must be signed and dated and must name the Complete Streets Technical Assistance Program and the name of the municipality applying. A sample resolution can be found in <u>Appendix 1</u> or downloaded from the program website.

It's best to start the process of obtaining this resolution as early as possible to allow enough time for the adoption of the resolution.

- Clarity of request (up to 10 points)
- Strength of request (up to 40 points)
- Opportunity for public engagement (up to 25 points)
- Strength of municipal team (up to 25 points)
- Additional considerations (up to 20 bonus points)

#### SJTPO - Complete Streets Outreach & **Technical Assistance Program**

With funding from the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO) Sustainable Jersey will assist the Alan M. They balance the needs of drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists, transit riders, emergency responders, and goods movement based on local context."
