Penns Grove Borough in partnership with Penns Grove-Carneys Point Regional School District will aim to provide the opportunity for students to collaborate with teachers, administrators, municipal leaders and community volunteers to act as wildlife biologists and restoration ecologists as they participate in citizen scientist programs to aid in the recovery of NJ pollinators namely the Monarch butterfly. In July 2022, the migratory monarch butterfly (Danaus plexippus plexippus) has entered the IUCN Red List as Endangered. Penns Grove High School has a 15' x 35' Monarch Recovery Sanctuary on the campus as a model example of native and sustainable monarch habitat for the community. We envision utilizing the grant money to offset expenses in raising native nectar and host plants to keep the program running successfully but to also expand and implement other ideas for the Environmental Science Center in which the recovery garden is one component. No one should undertake the work involved in recovery gardens alone. The more dedicated people that we can get, the more sustainable the project will be over time. Further, the greater number of people involved will also learn and reap the benefits of education and community collaboration. All involved will learn science by doing science. This project is a great opportunity as volunteers can come alongside the school district's green team to tackle planning, building, planting and overall maintenance of the garden on the campus especially during the summer when the faculty is on summer break but the plant care is needed to sustain the pollinators that are greatly present on the campus. I have been actively involved with helping our students win awards since I have been mayor and receiving this community grant, I intend to continue to help them succeed. I have been told that our students' field experience, research, data collection, and discussions can drive change in the greater community at large. Because of the invaluable skills they have learned through this project-based learning, they can provide local solutions about this national environmental issue so that we can together engage the community and encourage volunteers to build habitat throughout the city.
